The dictionary defines 'vitamin' as one of the various organic substance found in foods and essential for the prevention of deficiency diseases. Discovered by Lunin in 1881, vitamins are required by the human body in small amounts.

So far, about twenty vitamins have been discovered. Each of them performs some definite function. The most important vitamins are A, B, C. Vitamin A is highly essential for the growth of the body and for the protection of the skin and other delicate part of the body. Found in milk, butter, eggs, green vegetables as also substances like cod liver oil. Vitamin A also checks infections and keeps the eyes healthy. Vitamin B, whose shortage in the body can cause a disease called beri-beri, is mainly found in cereals eggs, green vegetables and yeast. A good source of vitamin C is human milk but it is also present in large amounts in oranges lemons and fresh fruits. Its deficiency can cause diseases like scurvy.

However, an honest statement would have been, "During Governor Smith's term, the state had a net gain of two million jobs."
